AMERY MAN SENTENCED TO FEDERAL PRISON FOR POSSESSION OF METHAMPHETAMINE

Madison, Wisconsin -- Erik C. Peterson, United States Attorney for the Western District of Wisconsin, announced that Bradley H. Hill, 48, Amery, Wis., was sentenced today by U.S. District Judge Barbara B. Crabb to 96 months in prison for possession of methamphetamine with intent to distribute. Hill pleaded guilty to this charge on March 12, 2009.

At sentencing, Judge Crabb determined that Hill was responsible for distributing approximately 100 ounces of methamphetamine in northwest Wisconsin. Further, Judge Crabb stated that Hill's methamphetamine activities had a detrimental impact on his family and his community.

The charges against Hill were the result of an investigation conducted by the Polk County Sheriff's Office, Douglas County Sheriff's Office, Superior Police Department, Amery Police Department, and Wisconsin Department of Justice, Division of Criminal Investigation. The prosecution of the case has been handled by Assistant U.S. Attorney David J. Reinhard.
